29 Global Summit Delegates convene in Toronto

The Global Summit is Fora's biggest gender equity program of the year, bringing together 29 accomplished young trailblazers from around the world for a week of training that focuses on leadership development, advocacy, community-building, and policy-making. Every session is facilitated by renowned experts, and designed to propel these young changemakers forward in their leadership trajectory, and help them advocate for gender equity and social justice on the local and global scale.

This year, 29 young women and leaders navigating gender-based discrimination came together from 24 countries, to take their leadership to the next level and connect with a global network of like-minded peers.

The Global Summit Event

On Friday, November 4, we were joined by 200+ members of our community at the Global Summit event, Innovation for an Equitable Future.

- Innovation and the Next Generation: How Youth are Creating Change through Technology, featuring Fae Johnstone (Wisdom2Action Consulting), Samanta Krishnapillai (On Canada Project), Zhané Stimpson, moderated by Alexandria Bohémier

Over breakfast, lunch, and an evening reception immediately following the event, panelists and participants connected and networked with one another, building relationships that will last far beyond the Global Summit.

Reflecting our community

- 114 attendees were age 30 or under, including over 50 high school students attending their first Fora event
- Keynote delivered by 18-year-old Torontobased climate activist and poet, Sarah Syed
- Our speakers reflected our community, and included the voices of racialized, Indigenous, trans and nonbinary experts. As part of our commitment to representation, over 75% of the event speakers and panelists were Black, Indigenous, or People of Colour.







Leaders Tackle the Gender Gap

Panelists Rina Taddei (Air Canada) and Lechin Lu (University of Toronto), moderated by Sally Dimachki (Employment and Social Development Canada) discussed the significant work that remains to be done in "Making Cents: Closing the Economic Gender Gap." Panelists highlighted that empowered young leaders who navigate gender-based barriers can drive economic resiliency and societal stability by contributing skills, knowledge, innovation, and creativity to new and existing markets.

- How to Create Boundaries, a workshop delivered by registered psychotherapist, Hillaree Alliman
- Training to further their understanding on the decision-making processes at the United Nations and Commission on the Status of Women, and additional knowledge and tools to advocate within these important decision-making spaces.

All delegates will be paired with a mentor from Bain to help them build confidence, plan impactful initiatives, work towards their personal career development goals, and amplify social impact in their home communities.
